If you would like to raise your child's awareness of road safety, then sign up for Bikeability. The Bikeability Level 1 course aims to develop mastery in cycle handling in an off-road environment and prepare riders for cycling on the road. Bikeability is government-recognised, practical and professional training. Level 1 will take place in School on Monday 10th February, the cost is £16. On successful completion of Level 1, the children will complete Level 2 free of charge on Tuesday 11th February. All that is needed is a roadworthy bike and a helmet. Make Every day Count!

In order for children to gain the most from their education we need attendance to be of a high percentage. Why is it important that your child attends school every day?

A child who has good attendance – above 98%

- Understands lessons better
- Achieves better results
- Finds it easier to sustain friendships
- Can have good self-esteem and confidence

A child who has unsatisfactory attendance below 95%

- Finds it difficult to join in with lessons
- Falls behind with their learning
- Finds it difficult to maintain friendships
- Has lower self-esteem and confidence

What can you do to help?

- Avoid taking term time holidays
- Make medical appointments outside of the school day
- If your child seems anxious about going to school please speak to the class teacher
- Develop back up plans for getting your child to school if something comes up
