Another busy week has flown by here at Bovington Academy.



If you would like to raise your child's awareness of road safety, then sign up for Bikeability. The Bikeability Level 1 course aims to develop mastery in cycle handling in an off-road environment and prepare riders for cycling on the road. Bikeability is government-recognised, practical and professional training. Level 1 will take place in School on Monday 10th February, the cost is £16. On successful completion of Level 1, the children will complete Level 2 free of charge on Tuesday 11th February. All that is needed is a roadworthy bike and a helmet. Please sign up at the School office. This is a fantastic opportunity to raise awareness of road and cycling safety.
