
Our protocol with regards to children presenting with symptoms

If you phone in to the school office with regards to your child being ill they will ask what symptoms they are presenting with. If symptoms are on the Covid list we will be asking you to seek medical advice (111) as to whether your child needs a Covid test.

If a child becomes ill at school we will isolate them from their peers and ask you to collect them along with their siblings and seek advice as above regarding a Covid test.

Whilst you are awaiting this advice and/or testing we ask that your child and any siblings remain at home. We would appreciate being told about the results as soon as possible as a positive test means that we will be seeking advice from Public Health England.

We really do appreciate how time consuming and disruptive this may be for families but we need to ensure that we are keeping the staff team and the children as safe as possible.



Pupil Premium Free School Meals

You might be able to claim free school meals and uniform allowance if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit. This is as long as you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and your annual gross income isn't more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' payment (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit

If you fit the eligibility criteria for free schools meals, your child's school may be eligible for pupil premium. Pupil Premium is extra funding given to the school to support more disadvantaged pupils, of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers.
