COVID PROCEDURES When your child is in school, if another member of the family/household develops COVID symptoms, you must arrange for your child to be collected from school immediately and the whole family/household must isolate together until either the test results have been received or the isolation period has been completed. If your child has COVID symptoms they must remain at home and a COVID PCR test should be booked at a COVID testing centre. A lateral flow test at a lateral flow testing centre should not be used if COVID symptoms are present. There is plenty of guidance and information on the Government website.



### **Regular Testing For Parents and Carers with Children in Primary School and Nursery**



Free regular testing is now available for all parents and carers with children in primary schools and nurseries. Please note that it is not school that facilitate these tests and these tests are for those without symptoms. If you are a parent or adult of a household, childcare or support bubble you can either: 1. Get an assisted test at work if it is available. 2. Attend a test site to get tested (where you will be able to see how to take the test) or pick up tests to do at home. 3.
