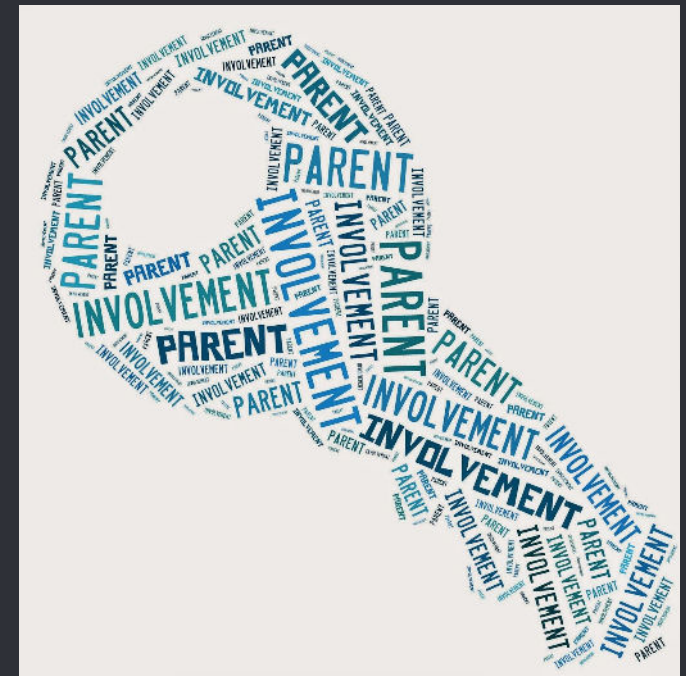

EVERYDAY YOU START HERE!

ARE YOU FORGETTING THE SCHOOL'S VALUES?

- Snatching equipment, poking or touching others
- Running in the classroom or corridor
- Moving from your allocated seat
- Distracting others
- Arguing with peers or reported unkind comments



THIS WILL LEAD TO...

- Given a reminder about classroom/playground rules (choices & consequences); ready, safe, respect
- Seating or grouping is changed
- Given 'Thinking Time' by yourself
- Partial loss of play - supervised by class teacher/LSA
- Given a warning



YOU ARE FORGETTING THE SCHOOL'S VALUES

- Continuation of disruptive behaviour/behaviour is seriously disrupting the learning or social time of others
- Non compliance back chatting/inappropriate responses to an adult
- Throwing, misusing, breaking equipment
- Continual unkindness



THIS WILL LEAD TO...

- Sent to another class for time out
- Asked to fill in a 'Thinking About my Behaviour' sheet
- Sent to Phase Leader
- Loss of play with Phase Leader
- Parent or carer notified
- Asked to pay for/contribute towards the cost of broken or damaged equipment



YOU HAVE FORGOTTEN THE SCHOOL'S VALUES

- Continuation of disruptive behaviour
- Fighting, intentionally injuring another pupil, physical contact to staff
- Swearing, racist/homophobic comments or abusive language heard by an adult
- Complete refusal to do work or to follow instructions
- Deliberately damaging school property or stealing
- Behaviour likely to endanger yourself or others

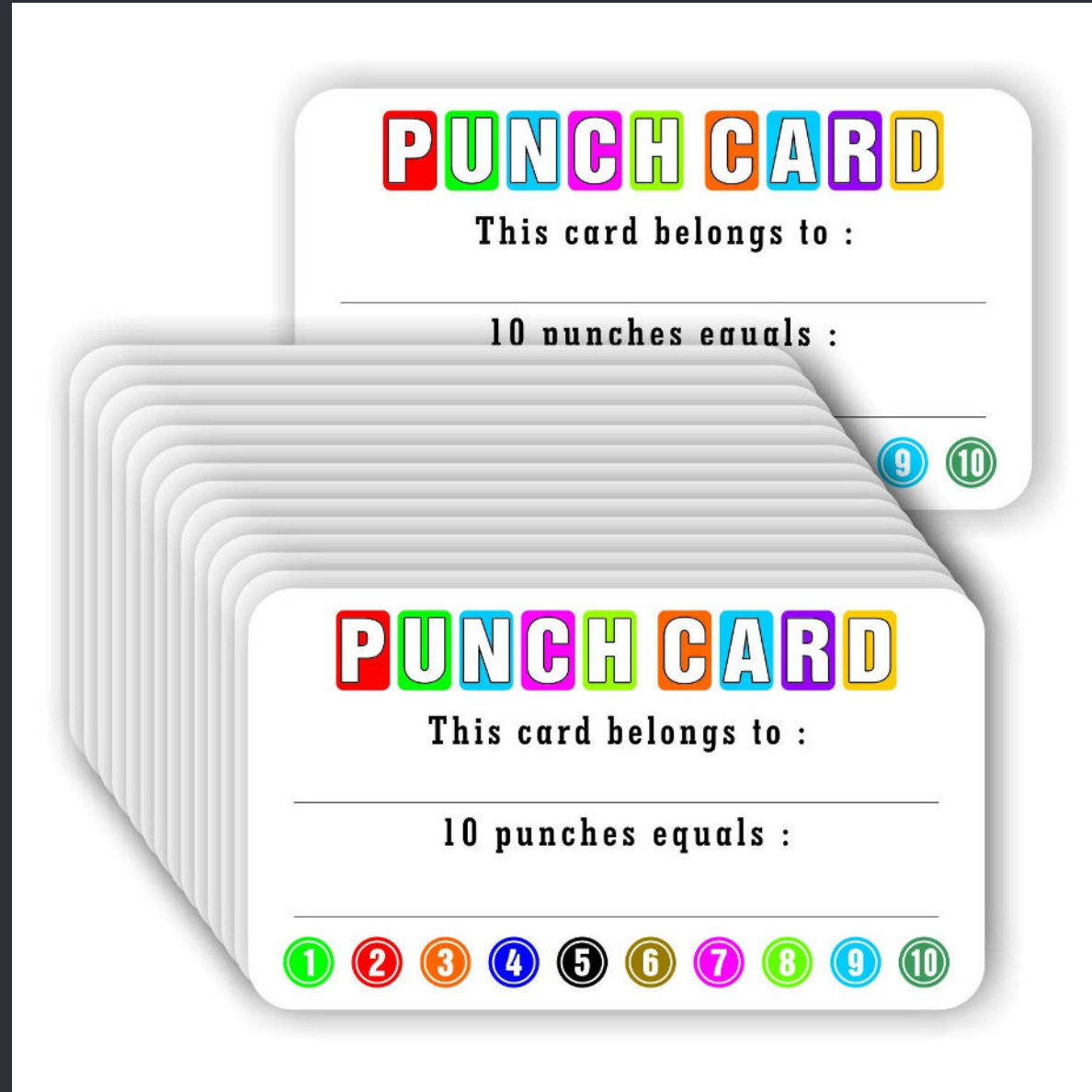


THIS WILL LEAD TO...

- Pupil will be sent to a member of the senior leadership team
- Loss of play or privilege
- Parents/Carers will be informed
- Detention; lunchtime or after school (in consultation with parents)
- Excluded from class for a fixed period
- Excluded from school for a fixed period
- The pupil's behaviour will be monitored by the senior leadership team
- The introduction of a Behaviour Report

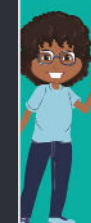
Hello from all of us at Cucina, we're delighted to be running the restaurant at [Bovingdon Academy](#) and we can't wait to get started!
