STICKY KNOWLEDGE FOR SCIENCE Animals including humans: digestion and teeth

- 1. Teeth are used for cutting and chewing food.
- 2. They start the digestive process which gives us the energy we need to live.
- 3. Humans look after their teeth by brushing and flossing and ensuring that they do not eat foods high in sugar.
- 4. Not looking after teeth can lead to an increase in plague and tooth decay.
- 5. The digestive system begins with the mouth and teeth where food is ingested and chewed.
- 6. Animals have different types of teeth, each with a specific function. The teeth an animal has depends on the animal's diet.
- 7. A carnivore has large sharp canines so it can easily rip and tear meat.
- 8. A herbivore has lots of large incisors and molars to help cut and grind vegetation.
- 9. An omnivore has a mixture of teeth due to the range of diet.
- 10. It takes about seven seconds for food to travel from your mouth to your stomach.

STICKY KNOWLEDGE FOR HISTORY A non-European society that provides contrasts with British history: Mayan civilisation

- 1. Maya civilization was from 1500 BCE to 900 CE
- 2. In 500 BCE, the Mayas started to build their first large settlements
- 3. Chichen Itza was among the largest settlement for its time of anywhere in the world
- 4. Mayans farmed on land they terraced and made fertile
- 5. Their staple diet was maize and they even worshipped maize as a God
- 6. Mayans drank chocolate it was unsweetened and spiced with chilli
- 7. Pyramids were built with temples on top and observatories
- 8. Maya worshipped many gods and believed in offering blood
- 9. Mayans are known for their writing in hieroglyphics, their advanced number system and their buildings
- 10. The Spanish arrival forced the Mayans to give up their gods and become Christians
