STICKY KNOWLEDGE FOR SCIENCE

Ten things you need to know about Animals including Humans

- 1. We have 5 senses: eyes to see; nose to smell; ears to hear; tongue to taste; hands to touch.
- 2. Animals have different skin coverings, for example, scales, feathers and hair.
- 3. A carnivore is an animal that gets food from killing and eating another animal.
- 4 A herbivore is an animal that feeds on plants.
- 5. An omnivore is an animal that eats plants and animals.
- 6. Animals need food and water to live; unlike plants (which make their own food) animals feed themselves by eating plants or other animals.
- 7. Animals are also able to sense (including see, hear, smell, taste, touch) what is going on around them.
- 8. Millions of animals live on earth.
- 9. Vertebrates are animals that have a backbone. There are five groups of vertebrates: mammals, amphibians, reptiles, birds and fish.
- 10. Invertebrates are animals that do not have a backbone. They include: insects, arachnids, and molluscs.
