## STICKY KNOWLEDGE FOR SCIENCE: Sound

1. Sound is a thing that can be heard.
2. The object that makes the sound is called the source.
3. When objects vibrate, a sound is made. The vibration makes the air around the object vibrate and the air vibrations enter your ear. These are called sound waves.
4. If an object is making a sound, a part of it is vibrating, even if you cannot see the vibrations.
5. Sound waves travel through a medium (such as air, water, glass, stone, and brick).
6. The sound waves travel to the ear and make the eardrums vibrate.
7. Messages are sent to the brain which recognises the vibrations as sounds.
8. Pitch: The pitch of a sound is how high or low it is.
9. Volume: The volume of a sound is how loud or quiet it is.
10. When a sound is created by a little amount of energy, a weak sound wave is created which doesn't travel far. This makes a quiet sound.

## STICKY KNOWLEDGE FOR HISTORY

1. The Ancient Greeks lived over 2500 years ago; Athens was at its height in **C5th - C6th BCE**, known as the Golden Age
2. Ancient Greece consisted of city states such as **Athens, Sparta** and **Olympia** who were rivals - each city had their own laws and armies
3. Much evidence comes from archaeology and pottery; many of the pictures in books are scenes from the sides of pots
4. The **Agora** is a marketplace in Ancient Athens
5. Ancient Athens had a diversity of life style depending on a person's position within society




