 Sound is a thing that can be heard. The object that makes the sound is called the source. When objects vibrate, a sound is made. The vibration makes the air around the object vibrate and the air vibrations enter your ear. These are called sound waves. If an object is making a sound, a part of it is vibrating, even if you cannot see the vibrations. Sound waves travel through a medium (such as air, water, glass, stone, and brick). The sound waves travel to the ear and make the eardrums vibrate. Messages are sent to the brain which recognises the vibrations as sounds. Pitch: The pitch of a sound is how high or low it is. Volume: The volume of a sound is how loud or quiet it is. When a sound is created by a little amount of energy, a weak sound wave is created which doesn't travel far. This makes a quiet sound.
