# No one is born great As historians, how can we use evidence to answer the question: Just how great was Alfred?

## STICKY KNOWLEDGE FOR SCIENCE

- 1. Animals see light sources when light travels from the source into their eyes. They see objects when light is reflected off that object and enters their eyes.
- 2. Light reflects off all objects (unless they are black).
- 3. Non-shiny surfaces scatter the light, so we do not see the beam.
- 4. Light will travel in a completely straight line until it hits an object that will reflect it.
- 5. Space does not have any light. We can see things in space due to light bouncing off of the objects in space
- 6. Light doesn't travel as fast when it has to pass through mediums that are different, such as air, water or glass.
- 7. The light that we see from the sun actually left the sun 8.5 minutes before we see it.
- 8. Light can be controlled and produced in so many ways. A camera can control the amount of light that comes into the camera lens. We also use light in televisions, medical systems, copy machines, telescopes and satellites.
- 9. Light is used by plants to convert the light into energy as their 'food'. The process is called 'photosynthesis' and converts carbon dioxide through the energy of the light.
- 10. Light travels as a wave. But unlike waves of water or sound waves, it does not need a medium to travel through. This means light can travel through a vacuum a completely airless space

# STICKY KNOWLEDGE FOR HISTORY

- The Anglo-Saxons invaded for a mixture of reasons often referred to as push and pull factors.
- 2. Most of the sources we have of this period are highly partial.
- 3. At the start of the period the UK was just a number of separate kingdoms. By the time William the Conqueror invaded in 1066, it had become a distinct unified country.
- 4. It was Wessex that emerged as the leading kingdom after the Vikings had wiped out the kingdoms of East Anglia ,Mercia and Northumbria.
- 5. It was at this time that England became a Christian country.
- 6. King Alfred is the only English king to be given the epithet 'Great'; not only did he stop the Viking threat going any further, he also extended Wessex's control and did so much to improve literacy as well as the arts. His descendants also did much to unify the country.
- 7. The Vikings started with ram raids on important religious sites Alfred deserves credit for reaching an agreement with them.
- 8. During this time the country began to be better run because more people could read and write, they kept better records, including laws.
- 9. Many towns and villages still have Saxon place-name endings.
- 10. It was during this period that there was a flowering of literature, such as the epic poem Beowulf, written for the first time in English rather than Latin. This put England well ahead of other countries at the time.
