Driving question: Who can help me?

## HOME LEARNING

**Communication and Language** Learn your address and practise what you would say if you were in an emergency and had to call 999.

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development Being Responsible** – give your child little jobs around the house.

**Physical Development** Get your child to feel their pulse when resting, then again after exercising.

**Literacy** Share books with your child about people who help us

**Mathematics** Read and write numbers to 10, recognising them in your environment. Look at o' clock on all the different clocks in your house.

**Understanding the World** Can you spot any emergency vehicles while you're out and about?

**Expressive Arts and Design** Pretend you are hurt and ask your child to be your doctor. Give them bandages or plasters.

## STICKY KNOWLEDGE FOR HISTORY

1. Use language associated with time, e.g. then, before, now, next, soon
2. Use pretend play to think beyond the 'here and now'
3. When I was a baby, I needed help to eat, dress and wash
4. People who helped me when I was a baby include a midwife, health visitors, parents, grandparents, siblings
5. People that help me in school are teachers, teaching assistants, the caretaker, midday supervisors and office staff
6. People that help me on the streets where I live are: the post person, window-cleaners, refuse collectors, street sweepers, police people
7. People who help us have changed over time, such as a milkman
8. Fire engines were pulled by horses in the past
9. Fire fighters have always used ladders to rescue people and water to put the fires out
10. Reporting fires and calling for help has the same telephone number, 999

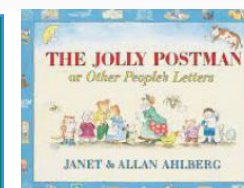
