STICKY KNOWLEDGE FOR SCIENCE

1. Different animals mature at different rates and live to different ages.
2. The stages of human life including prenatal, baby, toddler, child, adolescent, adult and old age.
3. Puberty is something we all go through, a process which prepares our bodies for being adults, and reproduction.
4. Hormones control these changes, which can be physical and/or emotional.
5. Humans reproduce sexually, where offspring inherit information from both parents.
6. The average length of gestation in humans is 280 days, or 40 weeks.

1. A producer is a person or company that makes, grows or supplies commodities for sale
2. A consumer is a person who purchases goods and/or services
3. Food comes from various countries around the world to get onto our plates
4. There is enough food for everyone in the world, but some people are unable to access it
5. Under half the food on our plates is produced in the UK
6. The UK imports nearly half of the food that it consumes - fruit, vegetables and sugar are some of the main products that are imported
7. The EU remains the largest supplier of food to the UK although we do source significant quantities of some products from further afield
8. Small-scale farmers face many economic challenges such as labour costs, lack of funding, climate change, lack of access to markets and limited access to technology
9. The global supply chain is the journey travelled by products before we buy them in the shops
10. Fairtrade helps farmers and producers in less economically developed countries receive a fair price for their goods

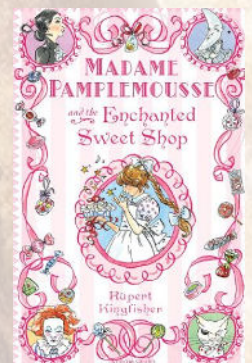
